

The Foundation seeks to grow wholesale and retail trade by 1-2% annually over the next five years; achieve the average growth aligned with the Jackson Metropolitan Statistical Area in the annual rate of job growth; and establish a business retention and expansion process that supports exiting companies.

Workforce Development: Another goal integral to economic development is to continue our efforts to promote and enhance the workforce through cooperation with our high schools, Tech-Center, Co-Lin Community College, WIN Job Center, and as an ACT Work Ready Community.

Leadership Development: Our Leadership Simpson County program [Simpson Leaders] will begin this month with thirteen of the county's most aspiring young business, financial, and community leaders taking part. The curriculum includes personality inventory, team-building and group dynamics; entrepreneurship; and public service; in addition, participants visit leading industrial and commercial businesses in the county.

Simpson Leaders is a joint project of SCDF's Division of Community Development and Copiah-Lincoln Community College, utilizing the resources of Co-Lin Workforce Education and the facilities of the Co-Lin Simpson County Center.
