Simpson County Economic Development District sells Simpson County Commerce Park. The Simpson County Economic Development District (SCEDD) has accepted Mr. Jeff Jennings's bid of \$202,070.00 for the Simpson County Commerce Park. The action was taken at a called meeting of the Trustees on December 17, 2021, and closing is to be within 45 days of that date.

The 110-acre property is located at Bowen Road and State Highway 43. Since acquisition of the property some 20 years ago, the SCEDD has aggressively pursued efforts to sell or lease the property for industrial development, including marketing of the property

through various sources, and has not received any relevant and viable proposals from any interested persons, firms or other entities desiring to purchase or lease all or portions of the property for industrial development. The only use made of the property since its acquisition has been for leasing a portion thereof for temporary storage of pipe and pipeline equipment at various times, thereby recouping the original purchase price of the property.

The SCEDD Trustees authorized the advertisement for sale of the subject property by closed bid, and the bid of Mr. Jennings was the highest bid and was determined by the Trustees to be fair and reasonable.

SCDF finalizes contract with CMPDD to maintain and host websites. The Foundation attained a long-standing goal recently when we executed a contract with the Central Mississippi Planning and Development District to maintain and host both our websites: the Foundation website at

In addition, SCDF and CMPDD will be working together on a thorough re-working and updating of the Discover Simpson County website.
