Simpson County Lake on schedule to reopen

Simpson County Lake is on schedule to resume its place as the "jewel in the crown" of fine fishing and outdoor recreational sites in our county. Also known to many of us locals as "Legion Lake," the lake currently remains closed for renovations and is under the care of Lake Manager Gregory Perry, Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks (MDWFP).



According to MDWFP Director of Fisheries Jerry Brown: "The dam repair project is compete and fish have been stocked. We anticipate reopening Simpson County Lake in 2023. This gives fish time to grow

and the opportunity to reproduce before being caught."

Mr. Brown also advises that MDWFP is in the process of making other improvements to the facility while it is closed, and he states, "I believe our customers



will be pleased." MDWFP will publish an article in *Mississippi Outdoors* magazine prior to opening, highlighting the improvements.

2022 Mississippi Scholars and Tech Masters scholarships awarded to Simpson County scholars

The Mississippi Scholars-Simpson County 18th Annual Recognition Reception was held on April 28, 2002, at the First Baptist Church of Magee Family Life Center.

Wesley Boyd, Jaylen Hicks, and William Kindrex each received a scholarship from Copiah Lincoln Community College. The following graduates each received a \$500 scholarship to the school of their choice from Mississippi Scholars-Simpson County: Jakob Lambert, Magee High School; Logan McGuire, Mendenhall High School; Anna



Grace Shivers, Simpson County Academy; and Precious Womack, Simpson County.

SCDF supports Mississippi Scholars-Simpson County and funds one of the four scholarships awarded annually.

The Mississippi

Scholars initiative and the Mississippi Scholar's Tech Master initiative are education programs managed by the Public Education Forum of Mississippi of the Mississippi Economic Council. In order to achieve recognition in these programs, students must commit to meeting standards in curriculum, performance and citizenship, including community service and disciplinary requirements for graduation. Beyond the personal fulfillment, a student who successfully completes the program receives a special designation on his/her transcript and diploma, a designation taken notice of by potential colleges and employers. In our county, the Mississippi Scholars and Tech Masters scholarships are provided through Mississippi Scholars-Simpson County, a Mississippi non-profit corporation having 501(c)(3) certification with the IRS. They are funded solely by contributions, and contributions are tax deductible.
